The school was officially declared open when John Brook, head teacher of Cowes Primary School, informed the Education Department he had officially opened school with 43 students in attendance.

SWIMMING

Miss C and her team are looking forward to a fun Term 1 in the pool. The swimming programme is a great opportunity for students to learn to swim, strengthen existing abilities and develop lifelong skills in water safety, all of which will reduce their risk of drowning and injury around water.

Cowes Primary School is one of the few primary schools in Victoria with a pool on campus. The pool is solar heated, and the water and temperature are monitored daily. The teachers will not hold classes if the weather is too cold, but it is often sunnier than forecasts predict, and swimming goes ahead.

We are sending a reminder to always bring your swimming bag on your PE day. Or even better, just bring it to school and leave it in the classroom. Our goal at the pool is for all Cowes Primary School students and the Phillip Island community to be able to enjoy our beautiful beaches and marine activities with confidence.

STATEMENT OF VALUES AND SCHOOL PHILOSOPHY

COMPASS SCHOOL MANAGER

At Cowes Primary School we use Compass to communicate and relay important information to families.

Compass is a web-based system that is accessible from any modern web browser (Internet Explorer, Firefox, Chrome or Safari) or by using the Compass iOS app or Android app.

Each family receives a separate log-in to Compass which will be provided to you upon commencement at Cowes Primary School. If you have misplaced or forgotten your log-in details then please pop into the office.

Your Compass Parent Portal will enable you to:

- Receive up to date class and school information including the newsletter, term planner & activities notices.
- Approve or enter upcoming or past absences
- Access your child's report
- Access your child's learning snap shots
- Update any personal details including address, email and mobile numbers
- Make Canteen orders (Tuesday Fridays) NB: All orders to completed by 2:30pm the day before
- Purchase Uniform via the Canteen module

PARENT/ STUDENT / TEACHER CONFERENCES

This year we will be running PARENT/ STUDENT / TEACHER CONFERENCES early in Term 1 so we can develop the home school relationship to support student learning and wellbeing. The conference will be held for students in Year 1 to Year 6 on February 26, February 27 and February 28. You will be able to book a suitable time through Compass (information will be sent home shortly). At the meeting, parents will be able to share information about their child and the class teacher will use the opportunity to share information about their initial observations. Prep parents will meet with their child's teacher on the Wednesday they selected.

ASSEMBLY

We have our first assembly scheduled for Monday February 12, at 3:00pm. The 3:00pm timeslot ensures students do not miss key learning time in the morning.

Parents are invited to attend assemblies.

WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK

If you wish to assist in the classroom, on excursions or at the pool then you must obtain a Working with Children Check. It is mandatory for all volunteers to have a Working with Children Check. Applications can be completed following the process detailed on the website below:

PARKING, TRAFFIC MOVEMENT and SAFETY

As always, I ask for common sense, courtesy and care to be used when driving and parking around the school grounds.

We have already had a pedestrian struck on Settlement Road this week. I cannot emphasise enough how important it is that all families and students crossing Settlement Road utilise the crossing. Although you may be accompanying your child, other students who are not accompanied by an adult may place themselves in danger by copying your actions.

If parking in side streets, like Walton Avenue, then please be mindful of road rules relating to the dividing line. You can't park opposite the dividing line unless there is at least three metres between your vehicle and the line or there is a sign saying that parking is allowed.

A reminder to all school parents that the parking around the PIELC roundabout is for those accessing the centre. We understand parking is at a premium around 3:30pm, however, it is important that these spaces remain free for PIELC families, especially those trying to juggle young children and prams.

DOGS AT SCHOOL

Dogs are an important part of life for many Cowes Primary School families, and as such are often included in day-to-day activities such as walking children to and from school. The school appreciates this inclusion and values pet ownership as an educational experience. The school also

acknowledges other people can find contact with dogs stressful, even frightening. All parents and other carers intending to bring their dogs to school must adhere to the following:

- All dogs must be on a lead that keeps the dog reasonably close to the adult at all times.
- Dogs' leads need to be held by adults only.
- Dogs should not be tied up and left near door entries.

CHILD SAFETY – STATEMENT OF COMMITMENT

Cowes Primary School is a child safe organisation which welcomes all children, young people and their families.

We are committed to providing environments where our students are safe and feel safe, where their participation is valued, their views respected, and their voices are heard about decisions that affect their lives. Our child safe policies, strategies and practices are inclusive of the needs of all children and students.

We have no tolerance for child abuse and take proactive steps to identify and manage any risks of harm to students in our school environments.

We promote positive relationships between students and adults and between students and their peers. These relationships are based on trust and respect.

We take proactive steps to identify and manage any risk of harm to students in our school environment. When child safety concerns are raised or identified, we treat these seriously and respond promptly and thoroughly.

Particular attention is given to the child safety needs of Aboriginal students, those from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, international students, students with disabilities, those unable to live at home, children and young people who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans and gender diverse, intersex and queer (LGBTIQ+) and other students experiencing risk or vulnerability. Inappropriate or harmful behaviour targeting students based on these or other characteristics, such as racism or homophobia, are not tolerated at our school, and any instances identified will be addressed with appropriate consequences.

Child safety is a shared responsibility. Every person involved in our school has an important role in promoting child safety and wellbeing and promptly raising any issues or concerns about a child's safety.

We are committed to regularly reviewing our child safe practices, and seeking input from our students, families, staff, and volunteers to inform our ongoing strategies.

PERSONAL ITEMS BROUGHT TO SCHOOL

Private property brought to school by students, staff or visitors is NOT insured and the Department does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage. This can include mobile phones, calculators, sporting equipment and it also applies to cars parked on school property. As the Department does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools and has no capacity to compensate for any loss or damage to such property



students, staff and visitors are discouraged from bringing any unnecessary or particularly valuable items to school.

NO HAT, NO PLAY

We are a SunSmart school and children not wearing an approved hat will be required to remain in a designated shaded area at recess, lunchtime and during outdoor class activities until the end of Term 1. Please ensure the hat has your child's name written on it.

ACCIDENT INSURANCE

All Principals have been advised to inform parents that the Education Department does not provide personal accident insurance for students. Parents and guardians are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including transport costs. Reasonably low-cost accident policies are available from commercial insurers.

MEDICATION

If your child is required to take medications while at school, you MUST complete a Medication Authority Form (available at the office). The medication will be kept in secure storage and administered in accordance with the instructions provided by the doctor or pharmacist. Staff are not permitted to administer medications without the authority from a parent/guardian. Please speak with Annie in the First Aid Room if you have any issues regarding medications at school. All medication must be brought to school in its original packaging that details your child's name and directions.

ALLERGIES



Food allergy is now common in school aged children. Children can be allergic to any food, and it is not possible to completely remove all foods from our school. To help manage food allergies in our school we ask all parents to refrain from sending nut products such as peanut butter, Nutella or nut muesli bars to school. We also ask that students do not share foods with their peers unless it is part of a celebration that has been previously arranged with the class teacher. For special occasions, children like to share celebratory

treats with their classmates. It is important that you make arrangements with your child's classroom teacher before such occasions.

ASTHMA



All students who have asthma must have a current Asthma Care Plan completed by a GP along with a school-based Student Health Plan (completed at school with First Aid Officer). These plans, along with a current Ventolin and spacer are required to assist staff

members to prepare and safely support students with their asthma.

SCHOOL BREAKFAST CLUB

The School Breakfast Club assists in making a positive impact on students physical and mental health, social skills, concentration, behaviour, attendance and academic outcomes.

Thanks to the fantastic support of parent volunteers and the Lions Club, Breakfast Club has run successfully every day with Wednesdays being run by the R.S.L.

PRIVACY

Our school collects, uses, discloses and stores student and parent personal information for standard school functions or where permitted by law, as stated in the Schools' Privacy Policy.

PARENTS AT THE POOL

Year level leaders will liaise with their team and if we need assistance then parents who meet relevant requirements will be approached directly to support the program.

Parents are permitted to the Year 3-6 Swimming Carnival (Friday February 16) but are required to remain in the designated spectator area at all times.


